## The 14th MIKE by DHI UK User Group Meeting was a great success!

Each year, the DHI UK user group meetings are very well attended and this year was no exception. The 14<sup>th</sup> UK user group meeting was held on 20<sup>th</sup>- 21<sup>st</sup> March at the Lion Quays Waterside Resort in Oswestry, Shropshire. The event was supported by 65 participants encompassing existing users as well as potential new clients.
